Staff, consultants, and third parties engaged by MannionDaniels are expected to demonstrate reciprocal duty of care loyalty by fostering an attitude of good practice and cooperation.

To comply with our duty of care obligations, MannionDaniels abides by the overriding principle that the health, safety and security of personnel is the highest priority and takes precedence over the protection of assets. In order to adhere to our commitments, we will:

- Understand and abide by health, safety and security laws, regulations, and standards relevant to our global operations
- Maintain good practice in relation to health, safety and security standards including identifying and assessing risks in relation to personnel for each workplace and operational context; and implementing adequate measures to avoid and reduce risks
- Provide safety, health and security advice for all of MannionDaniels' operations
- Provide suitable and sufficient information, instruction, training, equipment and facilities to ensure all staff and relevant third parties are aware of and are able to undertake their health, safety, and their security responsibilities competently, and in line with our standards, protocols and procedures
- Have adequate measures in place to respond to an incident and following an incident
